

## **RULES FOR SUBMITTING ABSTRACTS TO THE 18TH AMAZON GEOLOGY SYMPOSIUM**

To submit a technical-scientific paper to the **18th AMAZON GEOLOGY SYMPOSIUM** (18SGA), at least one of the authors must be registered for the event. Up to two abstracts can be submitted per registration. There is no limit on the number of authors per abstract.

Papers can be presented in two ways: **Oral Presentation and Poster**. Below are the general guidelines for formatting the expanded abstract.

### **GENERAL GUIDELINES:**

- a) Papers should be submitted in the form of an “**Expanded Abstract**”, containing between 3 and 5 pages, including text, figures, tables and references, and written in Portuguese, English or Spanish.
- b) The expanded abstract should be formatted on A4 size paper, **Times New Roman** font, size **12**, single spaced, top and left margins 3.0 cm and bottom and right margins 2.0 cm, edited in Word format.
- c) The expanded abstract should contain the title, author(s), institution, e-mail address, summary (an informative summary with a brief presentation of the objectives, methods or methodologies, results and conclusions of the work and a maximum of 350 words); keywords (3 to 4 keywords related to the theme of the work); introduction (brief introduction of the topic containing the justification for the study, the problem, the research questions and the objectives), materials and methods (describe the methods or steps used in the work to achieve the proposed objectives), results (expose the results obtained in the work), discussions (discussion of the data/results in relation to the knowledge already available), conclusion (objectively describe the main conclusions or final considerations of the study, even if they are partial) and references (in accordance with the standards of the Brazilian Journal of Geology (<https://www.scielo.br/j/bjgeo/>)).
- d) The expanded abstract should be in Word format and should not exceed 5 MB in size.

The text should follow the order and formatting below:

**Title of the Work** - Times New Roman font, size 12, capitalized, bold, centered and 12 pt spacing after the line.

**Authors' names** - Times New Roman font size 12, bold, centered and 6 pt spacing after the line.

**Institutional affiliation, e-mail address and specification of the origin of the work (optional):**

Times New Roman font size 11, centered and single spacing between lines.

### **Hierarchy of item titles and subtitles**

- a) Primary - Capital letters, in bold;
- b) Secondary - First letter capitalized, the rest lowercase, in bold;
- c) Tertiary - First letter capitalized, the rest lowercase, no bold;
- d) Quaternary - use subparagraphs (a, b, c, etc.).

**References** - Times New Roman font size 8, justified and single-spaced between lines.

spacing between lines. Formatting rules according to the Brazilian Journal of Geology (<http://www.scielo.br/revistas/bjgeo/iinstruc.htm>)

**Illustrations** - Graphic, photographic, photomicrographic illustrations, images, maps, etc. should be numbered sequentially, in the order of their citation in the text and all should be considered as figures. The title of the figure should be below it in Times New Roman font size 10, justified with the text, separated by a single space. Figures should be self-explanatory. Figure centered.

Note: Pay attention to the size of letters and symbols and the legibility of figures, as blurry, scanned and low-resolution figures will not be accepted.

**Lettering and illustration symbols** - These must be of adequate size to allow good legibility. Illustrations must have a minimum width of 8 (eight) cm and a maximum width of 16 (sixteen) cm and must respect the size of the A4 page. All symbols must be explained. Maps must contain a legend, graphic scales and geographic north inserted within the area of the illustrations, and geographic coordinates. In photomicrographs, insert scale and abbreviations. Note: We suggest using the international standardization of mineral abbreviations from Whitney & Evans (2010). Abbreviations for names of rock-forming minerals. American Mineralogist, Volume 95, pages 185-187.

**Tables** - They should be self-explanatory, with open sides, concise, and numbered sequentially. They should be written in Word, Times New Roman font, size 11, justified with the text. The title (heading) should be positioned above, separated by a single space. Table centered.

**Figure format** - Figures will be accepted in TIF and JPEG formats and must have a minimum resolution of 300 dpi;

**Formulas and equations** - These should be numbered sequentially to the right, with Arabic numerals in brackets and, in the text, referred to as “equation (1), (2)”, etc.

**Full papers** - Participants in the 18th SGA will be able to submit full papers for publication in the next volume of the book “Contributions to Amazonian Geology”. Submission guidelines, dates and rules will be announced after the event.

**Template** - An expanded abstract template, containing the suggested formatting rules, is available on the event website.
